The Rescue Train's Feral Fix LA AFTER CARE INSTRUCTIONS

- Do not open the trap.
- Keep the trap covered at all times.
- Recuperate in a climate-controlled/ moderate environment
 - No excessive heat or cold, if you are uncomfortable- they are too.
- Monitor every hour until you go to bed while the cat is in your care.
 - Normal Recovery Behavior:

Less Activity, lethargy, slightly wobbly, light panting, may see slight bleeding from ear tip. For females cats, a bump about the size of an almond may appear at the incision site- if no discharge, it may be a normal suture reaction and it will go down on it's own.

• Abnormal Recovery Behavior:

Continued bleeding or discharge from the surgery site, vomiting, dilated eyes, continued wobbliness, fast breathing and shivering the next morning. If you see any of these do not release the cat- they must see a veterinarian immediately.

- No suture/ stitch removal is required, unless you are specifically advised.
- Feed six hours after surgery.
 - A normal appetite usually returns 24 hours after surgery.
